ANNOUNCEMENT OF VACANCY

System Superintendent

Lake Granbury Surface Water and Treatment System (SWATS)

SUMMARY OF POSITION: The purpose of this position is to safely manage and supervise operations and maintenance of a rated 13.0 MGD (permitted 15.54 MGD) Advanced Surface Water Treatment System, a raw water intake structure, dual raw water lines (24-inch and 30-inch) and a 25 mile treated water transmission line. The Superintendent is responsible for ensuring the treatment and delivery of potable water to wholesale water customers of the Brazos River Authority in multiple counties in Texas. This is accomplished by blending conventionally treated water with water that has undergone advanced treatment utilizing ultra filtration (UF) and reverse osmosis (RO) to remove chlorides and TDS. The System Superintendent will ensure compliance with workplace safety programs, supervise plant personnel; write reports; review and analyze regulatory reports; conduct plant inspections; and maintain inventory. Other responsibilities include supervising required lab tests for regulatory compliance; working with managers, engineers, contractors, state and federal regulatory agencies; preparing and overseeing the annual budget; interacting with other employees and the public; and performing any other duties as assigned.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES: Ability to read literature, books, reviews, scientific or technical journals, abstracts, financial reports, and/or legal documents. Ability to apply fundamental concepts of theories, work with advanced mathematical operations methods, and functions of real and complex variables. Ability to write reports, prepare business letters, expositions and summaries with proper format, punctuation, spelling and grammar, using all parts of speech. Work requires the ability to troubleshoot problems associated with flow meters, pressures, biofouling issues, valves, transmitters, alarms, SCADA, CIP's of UF and RO and other related issues associated with UF and RO membranes.

REQUIRED EDUCATION & ACCEPTABLE EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING: Experience with Ultra Filtration/Reverse Osmosis (UF/RO) filter systems is required. At least ten years experience with conventional filtration system is preferred. Work requires knowledge of a specific vocational, administrative, or technical nature which may be obtained with six months/one year of advanced study or training past the high school equivalency. Junior college, vocational, business, technical, or correspondence schools are likely sources. Appropriate certification may be awarded upon satisfactory completion of advanced study or training.

POSTING DATE: August 16, 2011 - Open until filled.

WORK SCHEDULE: This position will generally work an 8 – 5 Monday through Friday work schedule; but requires the individual to be available after hours and on weekends; especially during high water demand periods.

CERTIFICATES AND LICENSES REQUIRED: Texas Class C Driver's License, Class B Water Certification or Higher

SALARY: \$65,481 annually to \$84,143 annually. This is an exempt position.
